1. SCHOLARSHIPS FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDY

ALEXANDER CRAWFORD SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship shall be awarded each year to students who are enrolled in the final year of a first Bachelor's degree and are pursuing a full-time programme of study. Candidates must have been residents in Wellington City for a period of at least five years prior to the grant of a scholarship, but attendance at a school beyond Wellington City shall not necessarily disqualify a candidate if the candidate is in other respects a bona fide Wellington resident.

Value: Approximately \$400

ALLIANCE GROUP LTD UNDERGRADUATE BURSARY

Open to candidates enrolled or intending to enrol in a full-time course of study within New Zealand and who would normally reside within the South Island. Candidates should be pursuing a course of study in areas relating to the meat industry, primary production or its associated industries, which would include agriculture, engineering, science, veterinary science, accounting, marketing, computer science, food technology, psychology and management.

Top-Achiever Doctoral Scholarships fund scholars to complete a PhD in any field of study. The scholarships are aimed at the top 10% of postgraduate students and run for up to three years. Top-Achiever Doctoral Scholarships are to be undertaken at a recognised tertiary education provider in New Zealand or overseas. The scheme provides annually a stipend (NZ\$25,000), costs for conference attendance, and course fees.

Enterprise Scholarships support scholars in undertaking a programme of research and study that in most cases will be at postgraduate level. The scholarships are aimed at the top 25% of those undertaking postgraduate studies. The funding is provided by a contribution from an enterprise plus a matched government contribution. Enterprise Scholarships can be undertaken at a recognised tertiary education provider in New Zealand. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of the excellence of the applicant, the potential of the study and research programme to build New Zealand's knowledge and economic base, the significance of the linkages between the enterprise and the tertiary education provider hosting the student applicant, and the financial support from the enterprise.
