Changing US Middle East Policy



Bio: Daniel Pipes is Director of the Middle East Forum, and a distinguished visiting fellow at the Hoover Institution. A former official in the U.S. Department of State, he has taught at the University of Chicago, Harvard University, the U.S. Naval War College, and Pepperdine University. He received his A.B. (1971) and Ph.D. (1978) from Harvard University, both in history, and spent six years studying abroad, including three years in Egypt. Mr. Pipes speaks French, and reads Arabic and German.

Dr Pipes is the author of twelve books on the Middle East, Islam, and other political topics. He writes a bi-weekly column for the *Jerusalem Post* and other newspapers; his writings have been translated into 33 languages. Mr. Pipes frequently discusses current issues on television and radio.

He served in various capacities in the US government, including two presidentially-appointed positions, vice chairman of the Fulbright Board of Foreign Scholarships and board member of the US Institute of Peace, has testified before many congressional committees, and has served on five presidential campaigns. He was director of the Foreign Policy Research Institute in 1986-93.
