Curtis-Gordon Research Scholarships in Chemistry

The Curtis-Gordon Research Scholarships in Chemistry were established by Gerry Gordon, a student who worked under Professor Neil Curtis at Victoria University of Wellington from 1961-64, and who became prominent in concrete research in the United States. The Scholarships were established through the Victoria University Foundation.

Scholarships will be offered for 2010 for students pursuing a BSc(Hons), MSc or PhD degree in Chemistry within the School of Chemical and Physical Sciences at Victoria University of Wellington.

Applications close **Monday 30th November 2009**. More detailed information about the eligibility criteria for this scholarship can be obtained from The Scholarships Office, 10 Kelburn Parade.

The scholarships are for one year and worth up to \$6,000 each for MSc (Part 2) and PhD study, and \$3,000 each for BSc(Hons) or MSc (Part I) study. The actual value of the scholarship will be determined by the selection committee.

When selecting the scholarship holders, the abilities of candidates to complete the practical requirements of the degree will be of primary concern, although the all round qualities of the candidate will be taken into account. Preference may be given to candidates who have completed all, or a substantial portion of their undergraduate degree in Chemistry in the School of Chemical and Physical Sciences at Victoria University of Wellington.

The successful candidates will be expected to contribute fully to the ethos, teaching and research environment of the School. In particular, they are expected to assist with open days, secondary school students' days and in the promotion of chemistry by the School of Chemical and Physical Sciences.
