# How to write your wishes on たんざく paper 日本語で


### I want [noun]. = [noun] がほしい。

Example: I want a new computer. = 新(あたら)しいパソコンが ほしい。

I want to [verb]... = ~ [stem of verbs] たい。 Example: I want to teach English in Japan. = 日本(にほん)で英 語(えいご)を教(おし)えたい。

I wish ...... = ~ [stem of verbs / potential form of verbs] ますように。

Example: I wish I could make many Japanese friends. = 日本人(にほんじん)の友達(ともだち)がたくさんできますよう に。
